
Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS

- 1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2). The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that-
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off

the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(a);
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second

day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Exhibition of films

	 Use the outside area for permitted activities from April-September between the hours of 10am and 9.30pm (to include live music, recorded music, dance and films). And between the hours of 10am and 6pm during October-March.

Representation from Environmental Health

Environmental Health would like to object to the variation of this licence due to concerns relating to the use of the garden for permitted activities (sale of alcohol, performance of live music, playing of recorded music and performance of dance). Please find the reasonings for this outlined below:

Relevant history

Environmental Health has a history of noise complaints regarding this premises dating back a number of years. Prior to the 2016 hearing, complaints were received regarding a once a month Soul Night which took place inside the premises. These complaints were substantiated, and the complainants were found to be disturbed when trying to sleep. As a result, Environmental Health worked with the pub owners at the time who undertook considerable sound proofing works to the pub which resolved the matter.

However, the 2016 hearing took place after the premises applied to make various changes to the licence including using the garden for permitted activities between the hours of 11am to 10pm. Environmental Health gave representations at this hearing and explained that, whilst they acknowledged the applicants efforts to make improvements inside, if the garden was to be used for permitted activities this would result in a rise in noise levels which will impact local residents. The hearing concluded that the garden would only be used for permitted activities during the hours of

11am-6pm (sale of alcohol, performance of live music, playing of recorded music and performance of dance).

Further complaints then were received in 2017/18 during Temporary Event Notice events in the garden. Monitoring was undertaken by Environmental Health and the Team Leader at the time, Mr S. Grant, stated that although the noise levels were borderline/unacceptable, due to the lack of frequency of events and operation under the TEN application procedure, no further action was deemed necessary. However, if the occurrences were more regular or to later times in the evening, there would be a nuisance to residents and enforcement action would be necessary.

In 2019, the premises then applied to make changes to the licence to again use the garden for permitted activities until much later than 6pm. Environmental Health objected to this variation for the above stated reasons by Mr Grant – if the occurrences of noise from events held in the garden were to become more frequent and until later times, there would likely be a nuisance to residents nearby. At this hearing, 11 representations were heard from people living nearby. They explained that some outdoor events held by the pub were 'unbearable' in terms of noise and that they were concerned that the excessive noise levels could have an impact on their health including stress, high blood pressure and heart attacks. The hearing concluded that the conditions added during the 2016 hearing regarding the garden use for permitted activities remained the same.

After the 2019 hearing, Environmental Health received another complaint about disturbance caused by the live music in the garden area. The complainant was provided with access the Noise App (for recording occurrences of disturbance) and the evidence they supplied meant that Environmental Health served an abatement notice based on the 'likely occurrence' of a statutory nuisance to reiterate the hours stated in Annex 3 to the licence: 'restrict the use of the garden for permitted activities (sale of alcohol, performance of live music, playing of recorded music and performance of dance) to during hours of 11am to 6pm and restrict the use of the garden for sale of alcohol to during the hours of 11am to 9.30pm May to Sept'.

Current Representation

As previously stated, Environmental Health would like to object to this current licence variation. The history described above shows that we have previously objected to similar licence variations and our reasons for doing so remain the same as now. Most importantly it must be highlighted that it is not possible to carry out sound proofing works to the garden. Any live music, performances, recorded music, films etc held in the garden will likely to be heard by nearby residents causing them disturbance due to the close proximity of the premises to houses in the area.

The above case history also advises that Environmental Health served abatement notices under the Environmental Protection Act for 'likely occurrence' of a statutory nuisance. The investigation of noise complaints is a duty which the team must undertake. In addition, if a statutory nuisance is found, the legislation states that action must be taken.

To clarify what 'nuisance' means in terms of its use under this Act – it is a significant and unreasonable emission of noise etc, which causes significant and unreasonable interference with the use and enjoyment of your home. It does not include noise etc from every-day activities. It is greater than 'annoyance' and is much greater than detection of a noise. The nuisance law applies to 'the everyday reasonable person' and cannot cater for people with a specific sensitivity to noise or special circumstances.

It is also necessary to highlight that not all the complainants for the previous noise complaints live directly next to the premises. Some live quite a significant distance away which emphasises the impact that loud music/other noise in an outdoor area can have on local residents.

The Chartered Institute of Environmental Health (CIEH) is always looking to raise the profile of how noise can have an impact on public health. Noise has a significant impact on people's health, wellbeing and quality of life. It has been linked to increasing the risk of cardiovascular disease and potential other cardiometabolic diseases including strokes and diabetes. The CIEH Noise Survey completed regularly provides valuable evidence that noise can profoundly and adversely impact people's quality of life, productivity, and peaceful enjoyment of their homes. For this reason, it is vital that Environmental Health raises this objection.

Although the current licence permits the premises to use the garden for permitted activities until 6pm (sale of alcohol, performance of live music, playing of recorded music and performance of dance), Environmental Health is of the opinion that the garden should not be used for these activities at all (including the use of an outside tv screen).

The garden cannot be made soundproof and taking into consideration the close proximity of its location to nearby residents and the history described in this report, Environmental Health believes that it is extremely likely that granting this application will result in residents experiencing a noise nuisance which will make them at risk of the health effects described above.

Although Environmental Health always works to support businesses in the Borough, we are also here to ensure that public health is not affected by nuisance. The summer months should be when families spend time in their gardens enjoying the warmer weather or be able to have their windows and doors open until later into the evening. They should not be subjected to noise nuisance from a nearby pub garden when just trying to enjoy normal everyday activities in their own home.

Granting this licence application will give the premises the opportunity to use the outside area every day, potentially up to 9.30pm, for activities which will likely cause a nuisance. This would not be acceptable to residents living in the area and puts them at risk of the health effects created by noise nuisance. Young children often go to bed much earlier than 9.30pm and it can be exhausting for parents, as well as the children, if noisy events prevent this. If this occurs week after week, Environmental Health has no doubt that the impact on health would be significant.

Finally, it must be remembered that the 2019 hearing had 11 representations made by local residents with a spokesperson describing noise from previous outside events as 'unbearable'. If this licence application is granted, it is likely that these residents will experience this again.

For the above stated reasons, Environmental Health has no other option but to raise this objection and bring it to the attention of the Licensing Committee for their decision.

REPRESENTATION of RESIDENT – ANDREW BROWN

To Whom it may concern.

For 28 years I have lived here, and the worse thing I have ever had to put up with is the Bread & Cheese pub, With Music, shouting, swearing and cars up to 1am plus. I have had drunks urinating on my van, throwing bottles and being obnoxious outside my house.

Plus what would make you think for a minute that any of the residents of Thundersley Grove or Mount Road would want to kept up until the early hours of the morning with loud music. The previous owner also done the same, moving the music from the rear of the pub to the front, and on so many occasions leaving the doors open because it was too hot. I have lost count with the number of times I had to go over there and ask them to turn it down and shut the doors.

And my wife and I having to try and sleep in the middle of summer with the windows closed.

I honestly think you have given no consideration for the people that have to live in and around the proximity of this pub and am absolutely disgusted that you would be happy to take their money for a entertainment license, Why can it not just be a place to eat and take your family as this is really lacking from this area, not some loud venue, and I am absolutely sure none of you live near this pub and have to put up with the Music, shouting for a single minute.

Surely as a council your first priority is the residents, I understand that Castle point has sold more Green belt land than any other council so maybe your drive for money is far greater than the peace and quiet that is my right to enjoy and not be forced to listen to loud music, every weekend.

Please for once in your life, think about the environment, wildlife and the health and care of the residents within the proximity of this pub.
